

BJP team meets injured workers in Patna, seeks judicial inquiry into police action

PATNA, JULY 16/--/ The BJP on Saturday asserted that the "state-sponsored and brutal" police action on its procession in the Bihar capital earlier this week warranted a judicial inquiry and intervention of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC).

A four-member fact-finding team constituted by BJP national president J P Nadda stated this here, as it met several party activists, who sustained injuries in the police action on June 13 and are undergoing treatment at hospitals. The team members also include former Jharkhand chief minister Raghubar Das and Members of Parliament Manoj Tiwari, Sunita Duggal and Vishnu Dayal Ram Tiwari, who is a Lok Sabha MP from Delhi, but has his roots in Bihar, claimed "71 BJP workers" were injured in the incident and "some of them were chased all the way to hospitals and thrashed inside the premises". Later, while talking to PTI, Tiwari said, "The brutal action of the

state police on BJP workers was pre-planned. Immediately after the lathi-charge in Dak Bungalow Chowk on Thursday, RJD leader and state minister Jitendra Kumar Rai, in a tweet, praised the police action stating that account has been settled. That shows that the police action was pre-planned. Hence, we demand a judicial probe into the incident by a sitting judge."

Duggal alleged that women BJP workers were "hit with lathis on their chests and heads by male police personnel" on Thursday when the party was staging a 'Vidhan Sabha march' in protest against the Nitish Kumar government's teacher recruitment policy. The team members alleged that the incident was "reminiscent of Jallianwala Bagh massacre" and wondered whether "hired goons were donning police uniforms". The panel members replied in affirmative when asked whether they would

approach the NHRC with a request to look into the matter. They said they will submit the report of their probe to Nadda, while strongly recommending a judicial inquiry. They said BJP state president Samrat Choudhary will pursue the matter with NHRC. The panel alleged that rules were not followed in use of water cannons, tear gas shells and lathi-charge, and claimed BJP workers, whom they spoke to, have insisted that it was they at whom chilli powder was thrown, and not the other way round. About the controversy surrounding the death of Jehanabad district general secretary Vijay Singh, the team members expressed dismay at the local administration in Patna "giving a clean chit" to itself even before the post-mortem report. Meanwhile, Neeraj Kumar, chief spokesman of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's JD(U), questioned the fact-finding team's failure to meet the bereaved family members of Singh. (PTI)

Rural polls results indicate Left is bouncing back in Bengal: CPI(M)

KOLKATA, JULY 16/--/ Asserting that the 2023 rural elections indicate resurgence of the Left in West Bengal after the debacle in the 2021 assembly polls, the CPI(M) said the binary of the Trinamool Congress and the BJP is not working in the state.

The party claimed that together with the Congress and ISF, they have clocked a vote share of 21 per cent in the panchayat elections, up from 10 per cent in the assembly elections.

"That the Left is ascending is a clear indication," CPI(M) central committee member Sujay Chakraborty said. The increase in vote share of the Left, Congress and ISF combined has turned the electoral contest into a three-cornered affair from the two-way contest between the TMC and BJP in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections and the 2021 assembly polls. The Left

parties have repeatedly accused the BJP and the TMC of mixing religion with politics to confuse the electorate. "The binary could not be made (in this panchayat election) as was proposed by the TMC and BJP," Chakraborty told PTI. The Left party, which had not been able to put up any remarkable fight in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections and could not win any seat in the 2021 assembly elections, claims to be steadily becoming a force to reckon with again in West Bengal.

In the 2018 panchayat polls, the TMC had won unopposed in 34 per cent seats with the opposition parties alleging intimidation and violence by ruling party workers. The BJP, which had bagged 38 per cent votes in 2021 assembly elections in the state, got around 22 per cent votes in the 2023 panchayat polls, the CPI(M) claimed. The CPI(M) said it started

making a turnaround in the bypolls after the 2021 elections, with its vote share steadily increasing in all these, including Ballygunge, Shantipur and also in the Kolkata Municipal Corporation elections.

Alleging that the recently held rural polls were marred by violence and rigging by members of the ruling party, Chakraborty claimed that there is no legitimacy of the result in this election "because of atrocities resulting in huge amount of vote loot and dacoity in counting."

He alleged that many of the winning candidates of CPI(M) were denied certificates despite having won, while the losing candidates of TMC were given winner certificates. The former Jadavpur Lok Sabha constituency MP claimed that "in spite of huge repression and vote loot," the vote percentage of

the Left and its allies grew by nearly 12 per cent compared to the 2021 assembly polls. He said analysts suggest the TMC's vote share could have gone down to 30 to 35 per cent had it been a free and fair election. "The Left and its allies could have been plus-minus 30 per cent and thereby it could cause concern to the ruling parties in both the Centre and the state," the CPI(M) leader said.

The ruling Trinamool Congress has secured a massive victory in the three-tier rural elections, winning all the 20 zillaparrishads and many of the panchayat samities and the gram panchayats.

The Calcutta High Court has said the panchayat elections and the declaration of results will be subject to its final orders in connection with matters that it is hearing over allegations of electoral malpractices. (PTI)

Bihar STF intensifies crackdown against illegal poppy cultivation to choke flow of funds to Naxals

PATNA, JULY 16/--/ To choke the flow of funds to left-wing extremists in the state, the Bihar Police has intensified crackdown on cultivation of illegal poppy in Gaya, Aurangabad and Jamui districts.

The anti-Naxal crackdown by the Special Task Force (STF) along with other security forces has dried the weapons pipeline leading to the number of armed ultras dropping drastically in the state, said a senior police officer. "Now the Bihar Police in coordination with the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and other concerned wings of the government, have intensified crackdown on cultivation of illegal poppy in Gaya, Aurangabad and Jamui districts in the state", Sushil Mansingh Khopde, Additional Director General (ADG-operations), Special Task Force (STF), told PTI. The ADG said despite law enforcement agencies destroying hundreds of acres of poppy plants each year, inputs suggest that clandestine opium poppy cultivation is there in certain pockets in Gaya, Aurangabad and Jamui districts. "Inputs also suggest that Maoists have been using opium cultivation as a source of revenue in these areas. They levy a 'tax' on poppy cultivators and small enterprises. Law enforcement agencies destroyed around 600 acres of poppy plantation in these areas in 2021 and in 2022 around 1200 acres were destroyed", the ADG said.

In India, opium poppy cultivation is

prohibited, under Section 8 of the Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985. "The concerned district police and other agencies have been instructed to keep a vigil on clandestine opium poppy cultivation in specific areas in the district", he said. Now, Naxals are fighting for their existence in Bihar as the Union Ministry of Home Affairs recently removed six districts from the Left Wing Extremist insurgency list, Khopde said, adding currently only 10 districts are considered Maoist-affected in the state. "The number of Maoist-affected districts will further reduce in the coming months. No major Maoist incidents have been reported till June this year", the ADG said. "Some armed cadres are only concentrated on the hills of Chakarbandha on the Gaya-Aurangabad border near Jharkhand and in the hilly areas of Jamui and Lakshisarai-Munger. The STF and Central forces have confined them there. We will soon make these areas Naxal-free," said Khopde. The Bihar government, after a thorough survey of the naxal-free areas, is working on initiating several developmental projects in those areas.

These projects include the construction of 42 roads in remote areas, installation of 67 mobile towers, health facilities and opening of schools. The additional mobile towers will strengthen the telecom network resulting in increased mobile penetration in these areas, said the ADG. (PTI)

Open-air Butterfly Park in Birsa Zoo to be opened to public soon: Official

RANCHI, JULY 16/--/ A open-air Butterfly Park, the biggest in Eastern India, will soon be opened to the public at Bhagwan Birsa Biological Park (BBBP) here, a senior zoo official said on Sunday.

The park has been built on a sprawling 19 acres of land, just opposite to the aquariums on the campus of BBBP, which is popularly known as Birsa Zoo, some 25 km from Ranchi city. Aimed at imparting educational values along with entertainment to butterfly lovers, development work for the first phase has almost been completed at an estimated cost of Rs 2 crore, the official said. A butterfly conservatory, landscape which includes habitat development such as plantation of nectar plants, construction of a walkway for the butterfly park, a pond and an entrance gate have been developed in the first phase.

"Some beatification and other works are going on right now in the park. It will soon be opened for public viewing in a month or two," Birsa Zoo director Jabbar Singh told PTI. He said that the park has been developed on a lush green area, which will help make visitors aware of the importance of butterflies in ecology.

Butterflies have an important role to perform in promoting awareness of the increasingly urgent need for biodiversity in the terrestrial ecosystem. The presence of butterflies in good numbers is an indicator of a perfect natural environment, Singh told PTI. Wildlife experts said that urban areas such as Ranchi, Dhanbad and Jamshepur are polluted with an increasing number of vehicles and industries. To reduce the impact of disturbance, thematic

garden such as a butterfly or ecological park is the need of the hour. The existence of butterflies in the environment is mentioned to be pollinators of plants, food sources for other animals and also have an important role in scientific discoveries, they said. Singh said that more than 75 species of butterflies are found in Jharkhand. A conducive environment will be created in the park so that butterflies could grow naturally.

"A covered conservatory has been built in an area of 900 square metres so that they could be protected from birds and any other prey," he said. The zoo authority will try to keep most of the species that are found in Jharkhand like twany coaster, sergeant, bush brown, baronet, plain tiger, lemon pansy, common sailor and others in the park. Plaint against Nitish, Tejashwi in Patna court over lathi-charge on BJP workers

PATNA, JULY 16/--/ A complaint was lodged in a court here against Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, his deputy Tejashwi Yadav and four others in connection with the baton charge on a BJP procession in the city earlier this week.

The complaint, in which Patna's District Magistrate and Senior Superintendent of Police have also been named among the accused, has been filed on Saturday by Krishna Singh Kallu, a political activist who had recently joined the BJP. The petition has been filed in Patna Civil Court through advocate Sunil Kumar Singh who told reporters, "We have prayed for trial of the accused against various IPC sections including 302 (murder) and 323 (voluntarily causing hurt)." Singh alleged, "The procession was peaceful, yet the police took recourse to lathi-charge upon instructions from higher-ups, including CM and Deputy CM, and one BJP worker Vijay Singh succumbed to injuries." The BJP alleged that its Jehanabad district general secretary Vijay Singh died because of injuries sustained in a "brutal" lathi-charge by the police during the party's 'Vidhan Sabha march' on Thursday.

The administration, however, claimed that CCTV footages showed that the deceased was not at Dak Bungalow crossing when "mild" use of force was resorted to and doctors at the hospital, where he breathed his last, found no injury marks on his body. (PTI)

Body of BJP worker found hanging in Bengal's Malda

KOLKATA, JULY 16/--/ The body of an elderly BJP worker was found hanging inside his house in West Bengal's Malda district on Sunday morning, triggering protests among a section of villagers who accused local Trinamool Congress leaders of abetment. Police said the body of 62-year-old Buran Murmu was found hanging inside his room at Bamangola, adding that he lived in the same house with his son and daughter-in-law. Murmu's daughter-in-law had contested the recent panchayat elections on a TMC ticket but lost to the BJP, following which Buran was assaulted by his son and other Trinamool

supporters, the protesters alleged. Police said Murmu's son Biplab will be interrogated. Malda North BJP MP Khagen Murmu alleged Buran's daughter-in-law had contested unsuccessfully for a gram panchayat seat on a TMC ticket following which Buran was tortured by Trinamool supporters after results were declared on July 11. The MP said the deceased was an active 'karyakarta' in the area and involved in building up the organization at the booth level for a long time. Accusing the BJP of resorting to politics on bodies, senior TMC leader Krishnendu Narayan Choudhury said the post-mortem will establish the real reason behind the death.

He said TMC is not involved in the incident
